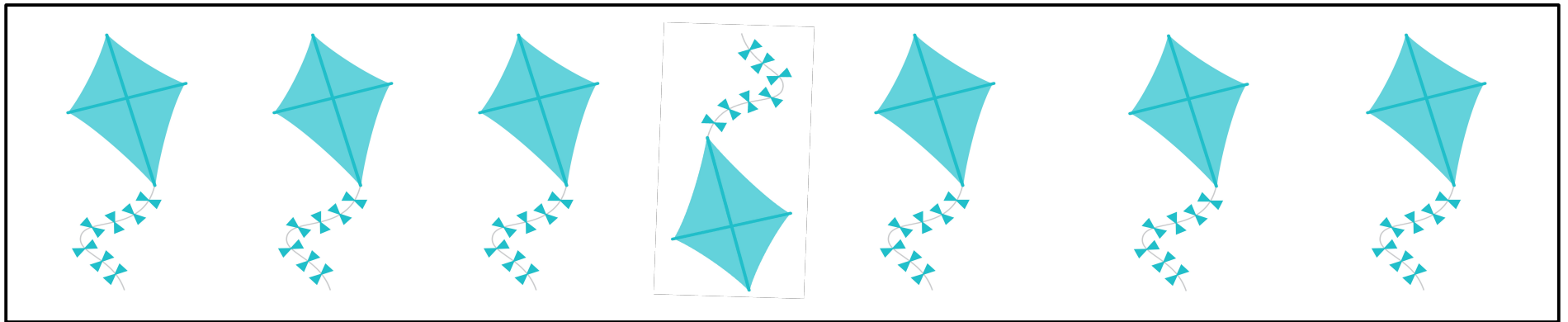
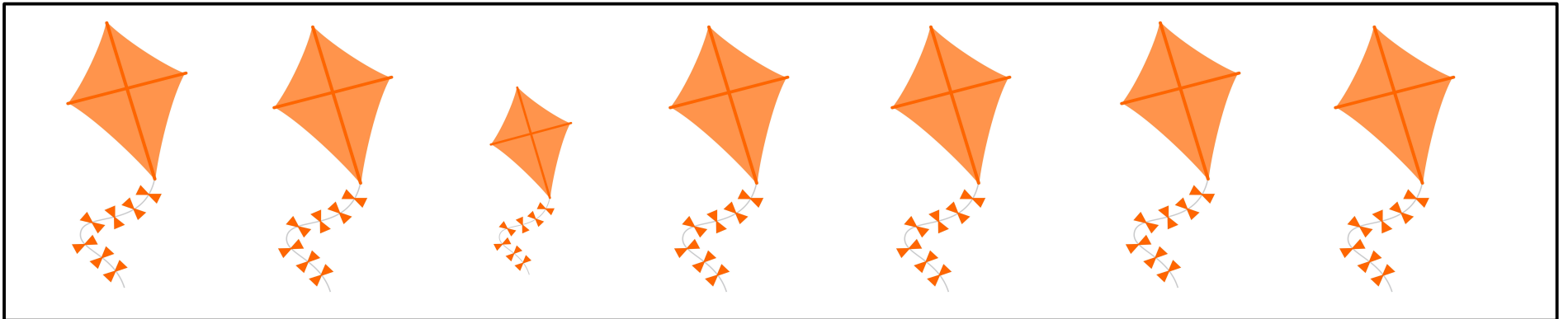
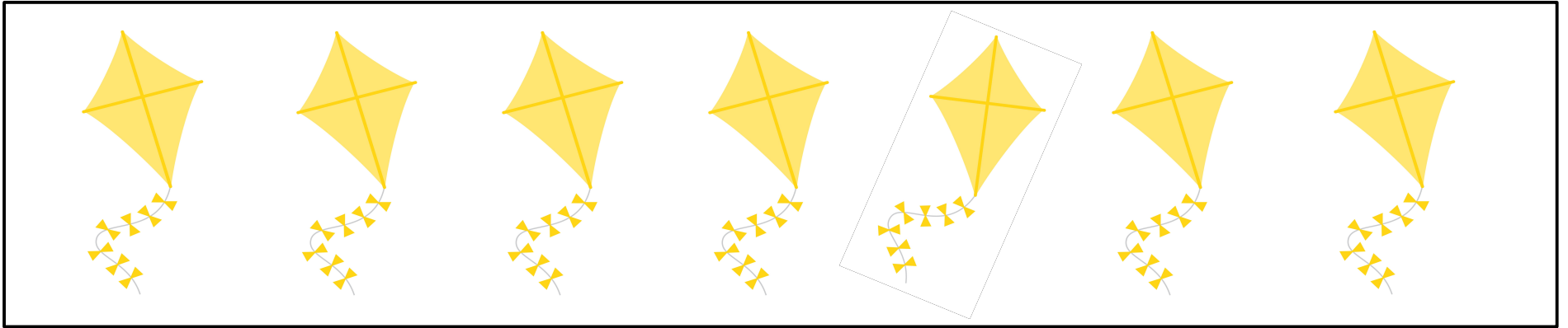


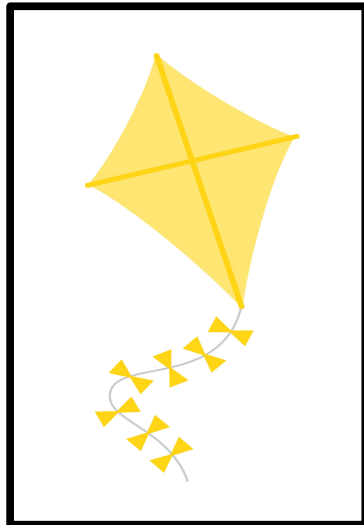
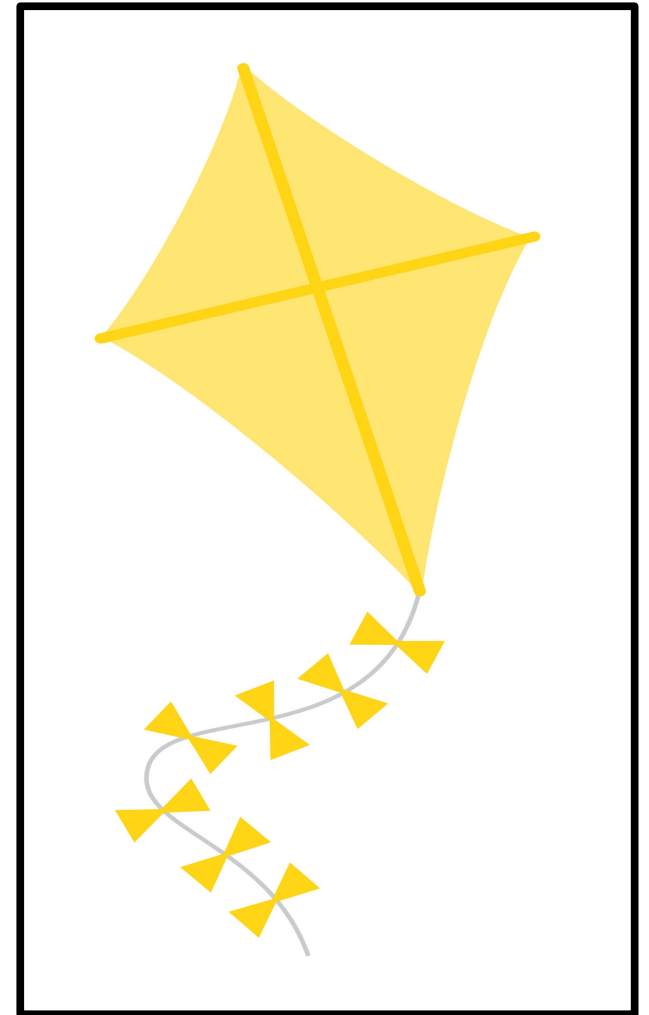
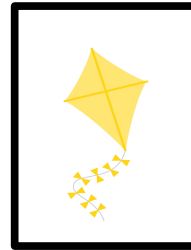
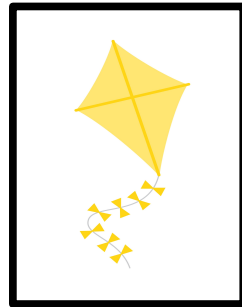
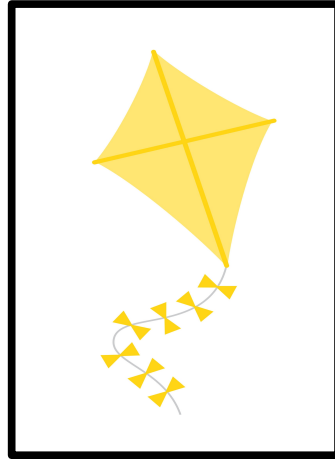
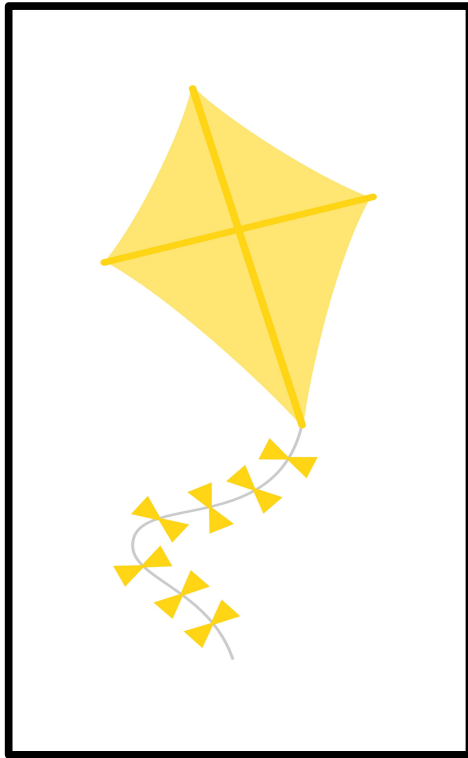


Circle or stamp the picture that completes the pattern.
